



Emergency Response Policy

Terra Walker Drilling recognizes that a prompt and efficient response to emergency situations is an important component of maintaining the health and safety of all employees, on-site client representatives, and any members of the public affected by an emergency situation on or near any of our worksites.

Our highest priority in any response to an emergency situation is the safety and protection of Terra Walker Drilling employees, as well as any client representatives or members of the public affected by the situation. Our second priority in an emergency situation response is to limit or contain the extent of damage to property or the environment caused by the emergency. It is the goal of Terra Walker Drilling to have the necessary equipment and trained personnel organized and available to respond effectively to a wide range of possible emergency situations on each and every one of our worksites.

Emergency Response Plans (ERPs) are official, procedural documents for organizing, coordinating and directing available resources in the event of an emergency. The development and use of ERPs is an integral part of our Emergency Preparedness Program.

Supervisors and management have responsibility and accountability for emergency preparedness. This includes ensuring that ERPs are in place, that the resources necessary to handle emergency situations are available in all our workplaces, and that all personnel working on each site are familiar with their site-specific ERP. In the event of an emergency, the supervisor on-site is responsible for executing the ERP. All ERPs are to be posted in a conspicuous place that is readily available to all employees in the workplace or the jobsite that they pertain to.

It is company policy that all workers are to be trained and aware of the action required by them in the ERPs that are relevant to their job and worksite. However, in the event of an emergency, all personnel on site are to follow the instructions of the manager or supervisor responsible for the work site.

All permanent Emergency Response Plans are to be tested (through practice drills, or reviewed during safety meetings and/or training sessions) on a regular basis to assess and ensure their effectiveness. ERPs specific to a project or remote worksite should be carefully reviewed by management and all relevant field staff prior to implementation. ERPs are subject to changes, updates, and revisions as scopes of work change, work conditions change, and/or deficiencies in ERPs are identified.

This policy and all associated Emergency Response Plans (ERPs) apply equally to all Terra Walker Drilling employees, managers, site visitors and members of the public on or near Terra Walker Drilling property or Terra Walker Drilling worksites affected by an emergency situation.
